PRELIMINARIES: The meeting was opened with a word of prayer from Bishop Karuru at 11am.

MIN 1(11/03/20): OPENING REMARKS

The meeting started at 9 a.m. with registration of the stakeholders at the registration being guided by Ms. Judy then followed the opening prayers from Bishop Karuru. The Municipal manager officially kicked off the meeting and started with introduction of the Thika Municipal Board Chairman and board members present.

Mr James Thuo. (Municipal board chairman) welcomed the public for citizen for and encouraged them to give their views. He informed the public of the project is funded by the World Bank for improvement of infrastructure.

He also introduced the present board members; Jane Wakobo and Paul Gachoka.

MIN 2(11/03/2020): PRESENTATION OF THE PROGRESS REPORT BY THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER.

Municipal Manager (Fredrick Mwangi) kick started the presentation. He gave the extent of the Thika Municipality that covers the Thika and Juja Sub counties. His current position is the Ruiru Municipality but is currently in acting capacity for the Thika position after the seat fell vacant. He explained the purpose of the citizen forum as enshrined in Kenyan Constitution (2010) and other various legal frameworks. He was glad to host the 3rd Citizen participation. The population as provided by the KNBS 2019 Census put the population of Thika at 405, 470 making it the 8th most populous area in Kenya. The wish of Thika is to be granted city status as Nakuru which has been granted by the Senate. This could be best realized by improvement by infrastructure through ongoing and proposed projects. The program and projects are going to be funded by a grant from the Kenyan National Government which is a loan from the World Bank. Therefore, the funds are from a conditional grant and must meet conditions to be released/allocated. These conditions are guided by performance standards. The County government has sought the services of a consultant to give guidelines on the requirements of KUSP to avoid investing in non-eligible projects

The above projects were subjected to screening according to World Bank Mandatory standards. Due to the Mandatory nature of the conditions, the projects that failed to meet the screening requirements did not proceed to design stage. The projects that were affected were fragmented and some aspects were located in rural areas. Therefore, the projects were rationalized and justified as described below.

MIN 3 (11/03/2020): PRESENTATION BY THE CONSULTANT.

- Global Urbanization Perspectives:
 - According to UN, 55% of the work population live in urban areas today. By 2050, 68% of world population will be living in urban areas which are characterized by global competitiveness, local economic development, urban investments, rural-urban linkages, specialized urban areas and industrial development.
 - 40% of Africans live in urban areas according to Mckinsey Global Institute. Today 25% of Kenyans live in urban areas-we are under urbanized. By 2050, 50% of Kenyans will live in urban area.
- ❖ Vision 2030 and the National Urban Development Plan (NUDP):
 - The overarching vision for Kenya is `a globally competitive and highly prosperous nation with a high quality of life by 2030-see social pillar
 - The Vision of NUDP is to have a secure, well governed, competitive and sustainable urban areas for achievement of the vision 2030.
 - NUDP objective is to facilitate urbanization, good governance, delivery of accessible and efficient infrastructure services
 - Provides a framework for sustainable urban development in Kenya to the benefit of all.

* KUSP Overview

- Program Objective: to support the establishment and strengthening of urban institutions and systems to deliver improved infrastructure and services.
- Program Description: KUSP will offer grants to national government entities, county administrations, and potentially, urban administrations that opt in to the programme and meet agreed minimum conditions and performance measures. Specifically, the programme will:
 - Window 1: Support National Government entities to implement the National Urban Development Policy (NUDP).
 - Window 2: Support County Government administrations to develop and implement county-level urban development policies and integrated strategic plans, establish urban management systems, develop legislation and regulations to better manage urban areas, help to build the capacity of urban administrations, and implement and enforce county policies and legislation
 - Window 3: Support Urban Administrations—through their counties—for the development of urban plans, systems, and the delivery of urban infrastructure and services.



General rules for UDG investments:

- Proposed investments must be reflected in the five year and annual urban Investment Plan
- Investments can be for both rehabilitation and construction of new infrastructure
- Project budgets should be 100% secured and covered the concerned fiscal year. No project shall start with partial funding assuming that remaining funds will become available later.
- At least 80% of the UDG shall be spent on non-moveable infrastructure assets. This means that overall, less than 20% of the UDG shall be spent on moveable assets (e.g. vehicles, equipment); this figure shall be calculated and show in the annual urban investment plan
- To avoid the fragmentation of urban investments (and reduce required procurement efforts), investment projects are subject to a <u>minimum</u> investment of KES 50 million (USD 500,000). This requirement is subject to the following caveat: Municipalities shall be permitted to combine a number of related urban infrastructure items in the same geographic area into a single procurement package.
- In order to finance investment preparation costs, municipalities shall be permitted to spend max 5% of their UDG allocations on the design, costing and supervision of investment projects.
